Attached please find another tentative schedule for the Bruckner Society of America / Bruckner Journal Conference, April 2-4, 2026. You will see that it has been slightly revised since the last one we circulated. People asked for more time for their papers. If you would like to update your proposed title, please let us know. The presentations will take place in Hendrie Hall in the Adams Center for Musical Arts on the Yale University central campus in New Haven, Connecticut. For your electronic maps, the official street address is 165 Elm Street, New Haven, CT 06520. Please note the only entrance that will be open is at the rear of the building off the parking lot. If you are coming in off Elm Street you need to walk up the driveway between Hendrie and the old white house to the right. For those travelling to campus, we have reserved a block of rooms at a reduced rate at *The Study Hotel at Yale*, 1157 Chapel St. Phone 203 503 3900 or 866 930 1157. There are many other more expensive and cheaper options near the campus. People have generally had a good experience with Air B and B in New Haven.

Both will bring you directly to your hotel and pick you up to bring you back to the airport.

Do not take the Amtrak train from Penn Station. It runs far less frequently and does not always stop in New Haven.

If you are staying in New York for a few days before or after, you are much better off to take the Metro North New Haven Railroad from Grand Central station. It runs frequently and is relatively fast. <https://www.mta.info/agency/metro-north-railroad>. You should take a taxi from the New Haven station to your hotel. It is not far and not expensive. Do not take the Amtrak train from Penn Station. It runs far less frequently and does not always stop in New Haven.

If you are driving to New Haven, take the Trumbull Street exit off I 91, go six short blocks and turn left on Prospect St. Elm Street will be the fourth one along. Hendrie Hall is on your left about halfway down the first block. Chapel Street is one block past Elm. Turn right, and the *Study Hotel* will be on your right a block and a half up. If you are driving, it will be best to park at your hotel and walk to the events. Parking will be difficult on campus on Friday.

If you are joining us on Zoom, Mike will send out the link a few days before. We have been told that the best way to listen to audio files is to set our Zoom to “Original Sound for Musicians”, turn your computer speakers off and use headphones.
